## **CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS**

**October 21-23, 2022. Hybrid: Present Online or in Person**

Would you like to present at the 2022/23 Meeting of the National Numeracy Network (NNN)? This hybrid meeting of the National Numeracy Network ([www.nnn-us.org](http://www.nnn-us.org)) attracts scholars from across the globe to discuss new and enduring challenges related to teaching and promoting numeracy, quantitative literacy and reasoning (QL/QR), as well as statistical literacy (SL) (among others), at all levels. Our meetings are welcoming to scholars from all backgrounds, and we actively invite individuals and groups, particularly those new to NNN, to share their work. This year, all presentations—those that are remote and in person at the University of New Mexico—will be recorded and made available to NNN members. Our keynote presentations will center on statistical literacy and making sense of numbers in a data-rich world.

There are a variety of topic areas in which one might present. Below are examples:

- QL/SL/QR coursework as a pathway to graduation and/or participation in STEM majors,
- Connecting QL/SL/QR with social justice and human progress,
- Connecting QL/SL/QR at the postsecondary level with curriculum at the K-12 level,
- Connecting QL/SL/QR with various disciplines: STEM, social sciences and the humanities,
- Connecting QL/SL/QR with literacies: information, data and statistical,
- QL/SL/QR centers (goals, resources, issues) and workshops (math across the curriculum), or
- Teaching QL/SL/QR to teachers in mathematics and other quantitative majors.

### **Types of Presentations:**

1. **Presentations (25 minutes):** 20 minutes for presentation; 5 minutes for questions & comments.
2. **Facilitated discussions (55 minutes):** Facilitators will introduce a topic for 20 minutes, and then lead a discussion or activity for 35 minutes.
3. **Lightning talks (3-5 minutes):** Presenters share the seed of an idea or project in 3-5 minutes

### **Proposal Submission Guidelines:**

Please include the following in your proposal. Submit to Marc Isaacson <[isaacson@augsborg.edu](mailto:isaacson@augsborg.edu)>.

**Deadline: Monday, August 15, 2022**

Proposals should be a **maximum of one single-spaced page**.

1. Name, professional title, and institutional affiliation of all contributors.
2. Title and mode (in-person or remote)
3. Type of session (paper/facilitated session/lightning talk)
4. Session description and justification: Clearly identify which topic you will address, your relevant experience, and--if proposing a facilitated discussion--how you will engage the participants.
5. A 100-150 word abstract for the printed program.
